






It's time to clear the air...

about Brantford's Clean Air Bylaw 

-  According to **Brantford's Clean Air Bylaw**, public places in the City of Brantford will become **smoke-free** on June 1, 2002. There will be **no smoking** in bars, restaurants, bingo halls or bowling alleys.
-  A separately ventilated, closed-in **Designated Smoking Area** may be allowed if it meets current inspection standards.

**Brantford's Clean Air Bylaw will protect the residents and visitors of the City of Brantford from exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke.**

-  **In children**, exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke causes low birth weight, middle ear infections and lung infections.
-  **In adults**, second-hand tobacco smoke causes lung cancer and heart disease.
-  **Bar and restaurant workers** regularly exposed to second-hand tobacco smoke are three times more likely to get lung cancer.



**There is no safe level of second-hand tobacco smoke.**
